## Work Weekend

In preparation for Sittingbourne's Steam Railway's Santa Specials, maintenance and repair work needs to be carried out across the Railway and that is the focus of this weekend's Work Weekend.

A Works Train will depart Sittingbourne Viaduct station at 10am to carry workers to Kemsley Down where the jobs will be assigned, tools and training will be provided. At about 1pm, a free lunch will be served in the Footplate Café and at about 4pm, the Works Train returns to Sittingbourne Viaduct (the journey takes about 15 minutes).

Everyone's welcome to come along and help out, free day membership will be provided for non-members. Please dress in layers as the weather can be unpredictable, also wear clothes that you don't mind getting dirty or damaged.

There's plenty of work to be carried out, such as gardening, building repairs and general maintenance of the track, coaches, wagons and locomotives. No previous experience required.

Further Work Weekends will be held on 8/9 and 22/23 November.

Santa Specials will be running on 6/7, 13/14 and 20-22 December, departing Sittingbourne Viaduct station at 11am, 12pm, 2pm and 3pm. Fares are £12.50 for everyone aged over 3 and £9.50 for the under 3s and includes a present from Santa or seasonal refreshments. There is a discount of up to £1.50 off all fares on all trains running on 6/7th December.

## Information for the media:

- 1. The Railway is rare in the preservation world as it was donated by the then mill owners, Bowater's United Kingdom Paper Co Ltd, in 1969 for preservation and still uses original locomotives, equipment and buildings. The SKLR is now the longest continuous operator of the railway and is operated and maintained entirely by volunteers.
- 2. The Railway was forced to close by its previous landlords in December 2008. Following the sale of the site to Essential Land in 2010, the Railway was able to reopen in October 2010 to celebrate 40 years of public operation. In 2011, trains operated between Milton Regis (Asda) Halt and Kemsley Down. May 2012 saw the full reopening back to Sittingbourne Viaduct station. The 2013 Season was the first full season operated since 2008.
- 3. Following a fire in June 2014, the last of the Railway's usable buildings was destroyed at Sittingbourne Viaduct, prompting the relaunch of the Railway's SOS Campaign this time to Sort Out Sittingbourne with the aim of raising £75,000 to improve visitor and staff facilities at Sittingbourne Viaduct station.
